4. Integrate fully all Reserve religious ministry support assets into the Total Force.
5. Increase religious ministry support of operational forces.
6. Increase recruitment and retention.
7. Improve external and internal communications.

This preview of our strategic course should ignite your creative thoughts and prepare you to contribute to mission accomplishment.

One of the best contributions each of us can make to mission accomplishment is prayer. I was reminded of prayer's efficacy as Chaplain Iasiello and I participated in the DC National Day of Prayer activities. We had the opportunity to speak to national leaders about prayer power.
