Dear Colleagues in Ministry,

It can also result in better goal setting and planning for the future. In 2004 we will celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Religious Program Specialist (RP) rating. Indeed, the rich history of those who serve alongside us in this primary support role for our ministry goes back beyond 1979 when the RP rating officially began. The challenges of implementing, defining, growing, and sustaining the RP rating is worthy of record and study.

After several years of planning and preparation, we have begun the fascinating, but complex task of organizing the immense amount of data collected over the years for the Religious Program Specialist (RP) rating history.
