Dear Colleagues,

Hundreds of our fellow chaplains and RPs are deployed to Southwest Asia and around the world. Others are preparing to join them soon. Those who remain behind support them in many ways. One valuable means of support is our Chaplain Corps E-mail System (CCES). For CCES to be effective, our CRB team must have your accurate e-mail address, and your account must be updated as your e-mail address changes.

The CCES was developed to automatically forward letters and resources from this office and from the CRB to all chaplains and RPs. Each of you has a CCES account address (Lastname.Firstname@chaplain.navy.mil or Lastname.Firstname@rp.chaplain.navy.mil) already, through which CRB forwards all communication to your command e-mail address. If you are a Reservist, we forward the e-mail to the account you designate.

Because there is such a critical need during this time of war to forward information to you in a timely manner, I ask you to update your CCES account immediately. To do this, send an e-mail to crb@chaplain.navy.mil with your current e-mail address or log onto http://www.chaplain.navy.mil/Personnel/update form.asp. You can use the web site to submit your change at any time.

You can also access your CCES account e-mail directly through the CHC website (http://www.chaplain.navy.mil). Start by typing your "log-in" and password in the login link in the upper right hand corner of the web site's front page. (**Lastname.Firstname** is the "login" and **chaplain** is the initial password.) Then you can open an Outlook Web Access view to read your e-mail. You can change your password by clicking on the "option" button on the left side of the e-mail screen, and then scrolling down until the "change password" button appears.

Thank you for your timely response. Your dedicated support of this key communication function of our Corps is vital as we seek to support the spiritual well-being of our Sailors, Coast Guardsmen and Marines.
