
And for that reason, we have devoted the FY 2003 Professional Development Training Course (PDTTC) to the subject of Conflict Management. This gives you a tremendous opportunity to hone your skills in this ministry area. Simply attend one of the 11 PDTTCs that will be conducted between January and June of this coming year. I mention this now because we recently concluded the validation, or trial run, for the PDTTC. Forty of your chaplain and RP colleagues gathered at NAS Whiting Field near Pensacola for a preview of the four-day course entitled "Lessons in Conflict Management: Human Factors in Managing Conflict." The Subject Matter Experts, conflict management professionals with corporate and governmental agencies, provided the validation group with many new insights and effective techniques, supported by stimulating group exercises and discussion. And now they are busy incorporating into the final product the lessons learned from feedback they received, making their presentations even stronger.

This year, we are bringing a new level of technical support to the PDTTC experience. We will supplement the traditional PDTTC course notebook with a CD-ROM filled with PowerPoint slides, class notes, background articles, and other useful material. In addition, we will maintain a web site throughout the "PDTTC season" and for several months beyond to allow on-going discussion throughout the chaplain and RP community about the PDTTC experience and subject matter.

You are the recognized conflict management experts in your commands; that's why so many people come to you with their conflicts. They expect—and deserve—the best help you can give them, and this PDTC will enable you to make your best even better. Plan now so that you will have the time and funding available to attend. Everyone will benefit from what you learn.
